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1. INTRODUCTION

Coahuila de Zaragoza is the third largest state in the country, located in northeastern Mexico and shares a 512-kilometer border with the U.S. state of Texas. In Mexico it borders the states of Chihuahua, Durango, Zacatecas, San Luis Potosí and Nuevo León.

Coahuila de Zaragoza in numbers:

It represents 7.73% of the country's surface. It has a population of 3'146,771 residents, 2.5% of the country's total, 92% urban and 8% rural.

The average level of schooling is 10.4 (almost first year of high school); the national average is 9.7 years of schooling. Speakers of indigenous languages aged 3 years and older are 2 per 1,000 people, the national level is 60 per 1,000 people. The sector of activity that contributes most of the state's GDP is manufacturing industries, especially the production of machinery and equipment.

Our entity contributes 3.6% to the national GDP.

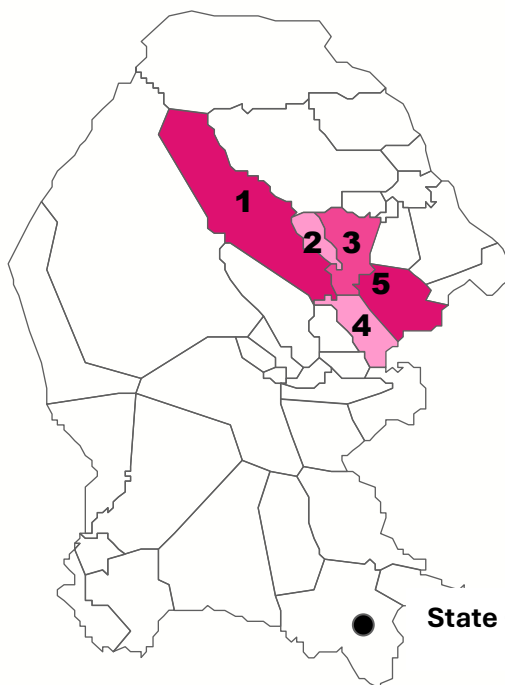

4. TRANSPORT INFRASTRUCTURE

4.1 AIRPORTS

The Coal-Mining Region has two airfields: one located on highway 57 Monclova - Piedras Negras - Sabinas km. 129.4 in Sabinas, Coahuila; it has a runway of 1,800 mts. long by 30 mts. wide, taxiway and general platform of 113 meters. Wide by 90 meters. Long; identified as runway 11/29, it currently does not operate commercial lines.

The other is the airfield of Múzquiz, Coahuila; with a runway of 1,200 mts. long and 19 meters wide; identified as runway 13/31, it does not currently operate commercial airlines.

The region has easy access to the “Venustiano Carranza” International Airport in the city of Monclova and the International Airport of Piedras Negras, Coahuila.

4.2 HIGHWAY

- ❑ **Federal Road 57:** connects with Piedras Negras, Monclova and Saltillo, Coah.; San Luis Potosí, S.L.P.; Queretaro, Gro. and Mexico City.



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- ❑ **State Road 93:** connects to Nueva Rosita, Palaú and Múzquiz, Coah.
- ❑ **State Road 95:** connects Sabinas with Juárez, Coah.
- ❑ **State Road 35:** connects Juárez with Progreso, Coah.
- ❑ **State Road 284:** connects Progreso with the Federal Road 57.
- ❑ **Interstate Road:** connects the cities of Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas and Anáhuac, Nuevo León.

There are also communication routes between the municipalities of the region.

4.3 RAILROAD

The Coal-Mining Region has railroad stations in the municipalities of Múzquiz, Sabinas and San Juan de Sabinas. The stations are connected to the national railroad network, allowing access to the country's borders, ports and major cities.

In this region, service is provided by the private companies Ferrocarril Mexicano (Ferromex) and Línea Coahuila (LCD).

8.2 “PUEBLOS MÁGICOS”

MÚZQUIZ, COAHUILA.

Located in the Coal-Mining Region of Coahuila, at a distance of approximately 354 kilometers from the capital city. It borders with the cities of Acuña, San Buenaventura, Zaragoza, San Juan de Sabinas, Ocampo and Progreso.

The place of men and women who fought for the progress of Mexico in the different historical stages, stands out for offering to the Revolution more than 30 young men who became generals for their military achievements. A land where traditions are preserved, with great paleontological significance and home to the two local tribes: the black Mascogos and the Kikapú Indians.

The magic of Múzquiz lies in its gastronomy, a living reflection of its customs, its interesting past, its ethnic groups, its wonderful biodiversity and its fabulous museums. It has traditional festivals and emblematic events and offers locals and visitors wood crafts, saddlery and even granite tables. Their majestic mountain ranges give you the opportunity to live a great adventure.

Those who visit the City of Melchor Múzquiz will have the opportunity to choose from a wide range of tourist opportunities: recreational, cultural and, of course, gastronomic.

It is named in honor of General Melchor Eca y Múzquiz de Arrieta, son of this place and interim president of the Republic in 1832.

Múzquiz, has an important collection recognized worldwide as a Lagerstätten, which is a denomination granted by the international paleontological scientific community as a place with an extraordinary heritage, with a high level of conservation in its fossils, also reactivated the Council Coahuila Land of Dinosaurs, The objective of this council is to design and promote new tourist routes based on natural wealth, historical and paleontological sites to take advantage of the potential of the state and its regions, enhancing the paleontological legacy of the municipality, to position it at a national and international level.

In collaboration with the Paleontological Museum of Múzquiz, we are working with the "Global Geo-parks Network", assisted by UNESCO, to obtain the denomination of Geo Parque for Múzquiz, and in this way promote actions directed towards the development and sustainability of these geographic areas.

Gastronomy

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Main Tourist Attractions

Local museums: In this Pueblo Mágico there are museums that offer to the visitor relevant information of the municipality, such as: History, Paleontology, Livestock and Julio Galán. The first is located in an old building that was formerly the "Melchor Múzquiz" school for girls built in 1905. The second, inaugurated in 2013, is inside La Cascada Recreational Park and exhibits the original fossils that have been found in the locality. The third features the world's largest horse saddle. The last one, inaugurated in 2016, is located in the house where the well-known painter Julio Galán Romo grew up.

El Nacimiento: Established in the hillsides of the beautiful Sierra Santa Rosa, 35 kilometers from the municipal capital. This area is inhabited by the Kikapú Indians, who do not accept visitors to their territory, and the black Mascogos, a colony of African-Americans, the principal descendants of American slaves in the 19th century. The black Mascogos strive to preserve their traditions and have started a local restaurant that allows visitors to taste the typical dishes of the Mascoga gastronomy.

Santa Rosa de Lima Parish: Built of stone in 1939, with 26 uninterrupted years of work with the philanthropic contribution of families from Muzqueño and the commitment of more than 20 women. The patronal feast is celebrated every August 30, in honor of Santa Rosa de Lima, whose name has been present since the origins of the city as a prison. The building, of great architectural beauty, has details that will attract the attention of any visitor.
